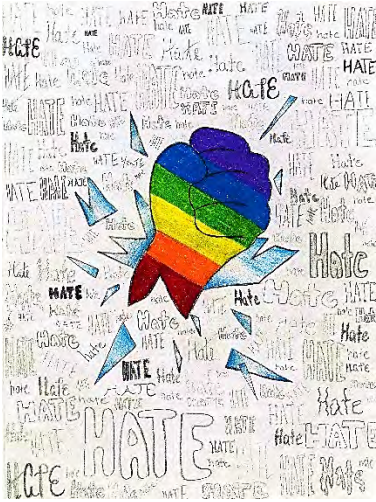
Love Overpowers Hate

Reagan A., 8th grade, Murphy Creek P-8

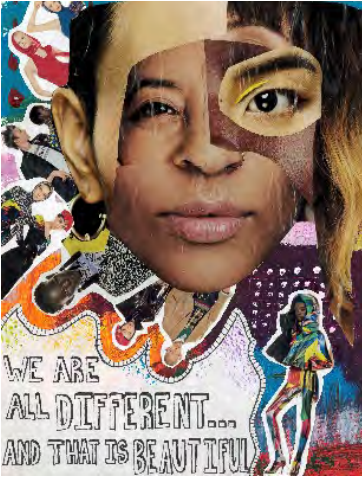
TITLE:

Sophie F., 10th grade, Boulder High School

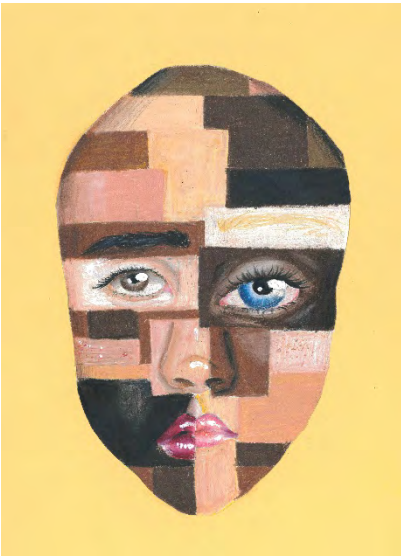
TITLE:
