TITLE: *Put A Little Love in Your Heart*

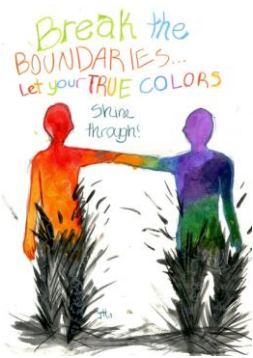
DESCRIPTION: Hope can change the world and make it better!
