DESCRIPTION: We celebrate our differences together.




Honorable Mention:

DESCRIPTION: It shows no matter what our skin color, togetherness brings love.




Honorable Mention:

TITLE: *One Tree, Many Branches*



DESCRIPTION: Everyone is human! Just like we're all human, all branches sprout from the same tree; each branch helps the tree to catch sunlight. All branches different together!


Ellie C., 7th Grade, Newton Middle School (Centennial, Colorado)

TITLE: *Diversity is Our Strength*


DESCRIPTION: It incorporates a lion which is a symbol of strength, collaged with a variety of people and culture to show that our diversity to one another is a strength.

Third Place:


Alexander P., 12th Grade, Boulder High School (Boulder, Colorado)
