STUDENT ART CONTEST-2022-2023

OFFICIAL RULES, GUIDELINES & ENTRY INFORMATION:

ALL ARTWORK MUST BE:

- Submitted by students in schools that are current participants in No Place for Hate[®]
- Original artwork by a K-12 student attending a school in Colorado, New Mexico or Wyoming.
- Created using computer graphics, charcoal, pencil, photography, lithography, pastels, oils, acrylics, crayon, ink paint, marker and/or mixed-media. ADL will not accept three-dimensional works, such as sculptures, castings or video-based presentations.
- Free of hate symbols or language (artwork with such symbols/language will be disqualified).

Additional quidelines:

The student's <u>first name</u> may appear on the front of the art work, but not required; only one (1) entry per student may be submitted; all entries become the property of

ADL and will not be returned; ADL may use all submitted artwork in private and public facing media, campaigns, products in both physical and digital formats; ADL is not responsible for lost, late, damaged or incomplete entries; by entering the contest, you release ADL from any and all liability.



The contest is divided into four age categories:

- Elementary School I (Grades K-2nd)
- Elementary School II (Grades 3-5th
- Middle School (Grades 6th 8th)

JUDGING CRITERIA:

- · Well thought out pieces that clearly address chosen theme
- Depth of feeling about the subject
- Originality and imagination
- Expression and style

TWO WAYS TO ENTER:

When choosing from the entry methods below, note that you <u>must use one OR the other</u>. For example, you cannot fill out the online entry form and then mail your artwork; the reverse (filling out the downloaded form and then trying to upload the artwork via the online form) will also not work.

1. United States Postal Service (or other shipping service)

- Visit <u>mountainstates.adl.org/adls-student-art-contest-for-npfh-schools/</u> and download and complete the Entry Form entitled *ADL's No Place for Hate Student Art Contest*. If the student is under the age of 18, the form <u>must</u> be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- Mail-in submissions must be delivered to: ADL, 1120 Lincoln St., Suite 1301, Denver, CO 80203—Attn: Student Art Contest.

2. Online
